

The Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Response Collaboration with the U.S.

January, 2023; Taipei City, Taiwan

On 17 January, the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the United States and the American Institute in Taiwan signed a Memorandum of Understanding on the "Establishment of a Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Response Working Group", and have identified the National Science and Technology Center for Disaster Reduction (NCDR) and the Center for Excellence in Disaster Management and Humanitarian Assistance (CFE-DM) to be jointly responsible for following implementation.




Figure 4 The 2nd NIED-NCDR Workshop in Tsukuba, Japan
